It is important to listen to the voices of Mahatma Gandhi and Nelson Mandela- who have been and would always be two of the most important visionaries of the bygone century. It was very opportune to name India-South Africa series as Gandhi-Mandela Freedom series. The first T20 match of the series was played in Dharamshala on 2<sup>nd</sup> of Oct 2015, 146<sup>th</sup> birth anniversary of father of the nation. In this high voltage cricketing extravaganza, South Africa beat the host team by seven wickets with two balls remaining. A nail-biting finish indeed!! In the lush green grounds with might Dhauladhars as its backdrop, the turn up of the crowd was immensely encouraging for the teams. Among the cheers of the crowd Rohit Sharma scored a ton on the HPCA cricket ground. For the record, it was debut match for the new cricketing star on the Indian firmament, S. Arvind.

The occasion became historic for one more reason. BCCI launched a specially minted toss coin which will be used by India and South Africa for all the formats of the game played between two countries for perpetuity. This 20 grams gold plated sterling silver coin features images of Gandhi and Mandela as Heads and the Freedom Series as Tails. Anurag Thakur commented that "this coin will keep reminding everyone about the teachings of both the great leaders and also the strong bond India and South Africa share historically."





The sixth edition of the ICC World Twenty20 championship was held in India from 8 March to 3 April 2016, Dharamshala was announced as one of the eight venues of the event. HPCA stadium had the privilege of hosting thirteen matches of ICC T20 World Cup, including warm up matches. Not only did the crowd witness the splendid show of Men's cricket, it also cheered warmly for the Women ICC T20 world cup matches held in Dharamshala. Over the years, HPCA stadium, Dharamshala has scaled newer heights over the years. Flawless organization of this series added one more feather to its cap and justified its nomination as one of the six new test venues in India.

Conclave is an occasion for sitting together, reflecting together, brainstorming together and planning together for a better future. The newly elected President of BCCI came up with a vision to organize a conclave of BCCI officials and various stakeholders as an annual event. The very first BCCI Annual Cricket Conclave was held from 21-24<sup>th</sup> June 2016 in Dharamshala. It included all the BCCI members, Ranji coaches and captains, along with media managers from all the State Cricket Associations.



A series of important decisions were taken during this four day conclave. Key decisions were as under:

- a. Approval of appointment of Anil Kumble as Head Coach of the Indian Cricket Team .
- b. Technical Committee recommendation to hold Ranji Trophy matches at neutral venues was approved.
- c. BCCI will explore the option of hosting Mini IPL overseas in September.
- d. Working Committee approved the following suggestions of the Junior Committee.
  - Under 19 Cricketer can represent India only once in the ICC Under-19 World Cup.
  - Any player entering the system at Under 19 stage can play only two seasons of Under 19 cricket.
- e. To popularize Test Cricket, BCCI will have a separate marketing budget in the coming season.
- f. The BCCI and the State Units will work together towards promotion and marketing of International matches.
- g. BCCI will enter into Venue agreements with the associations hosting international matches in the coming season, defining their roles and responsibilities and minimum standards required.
- h. Working Committee decided to start a new T20 league in place of Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy. Firstly, all state teams will play an Inter zonal league in their respective zones. All five zones selecting a zonal side to play an Inter Zonal League will follow it.
- i. Working Committee approved the proposal of Media Committee to issue an Annual Season Media Accreditation card.
- j. BCCI will start annual awards for state associations in the following categories: Best Website, Best Facebook page, Best Twitter Handle, Best Instagram, Best Media Facility, Best Media Operations. This will encourage state associations to be more transparent and professional.





## BCCI LEVEL-I UMPIRES SEMINAR 2016

BCCI is committed to build quality pool of professionally competent umpires. In this series, an Umpire's Level-I Seminar was conducted by BCCI in the Dharamshala cricket Stadium from 11<sup>th</sup> to 14<sup>th</sup> May, 2016. In this extremely rigorous course, 22 people participated and went through a demanding evaluation process.

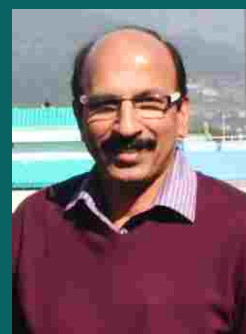

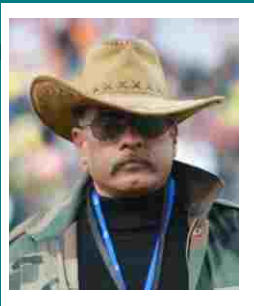

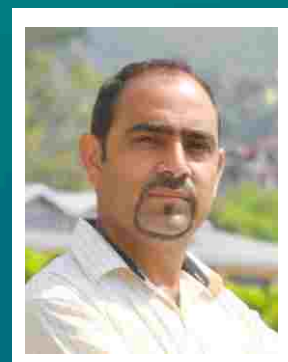
